ABOUT NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

National Service Scheme (NSS) Indian government sector and public sector program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the central government Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhi's Centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community (esp. Villages) linkage.

The idea of National Service Scheme was first proposed by Major General Mr Rao. Later, the UniversityGrants Commission, headed by S.Radhakrishnan officially recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January, 1950; after examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In the draft, the first five year plan adopted by the government in 1952 and the need for social and labour service by Indian students for one year was stressed. In 1958 Jawaharlal nehru in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. He directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions.

The symbol for the NSS has been based on the giant Rath Wheel of the worldfamous Konark Sun Temple (The Black Pagoda) situated in Odisha India. The wheel portrays the cycle of creation, preservation and release. It signifies the movement in life across time and space, the symbol thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change. The eight bars in the wheel represents 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, THRUNAL GULLEGE

A comprehensive strategy is essential to create a society free from gender-based violence.

Self-defense classes for girls aim to empower them to prevent and respond to violence effectively. Involvements include teaching physical techniques, promoting situational awareness, emphasizing personal safety strategies, assessing and minimizing risks, educating on consent and assertiveness, fostering mental strength, practicing verbal de-escalation, simulating scenarios through role-playing, conducting educational workshops, building support networks, enhancing confidence, providing continuous training, raising awareness of legal rights, offering crisis intervention guidance, and encouraging community engagement. These classes contribute to equipping girls with practical skills, confidence, and a proactive mindset for personal safety and empowerment.


expression of unity, emphasizing the importance of collective effort for the greater good.


NSS SCTCE were much committed to promote the rich cultural traditions of Onam and to ensure the success of programs happening throughout the district.



Once the Aadhaar is linked, the electoral roll data system will issue alerts on the existence of previous registrations whenever a person will apply for new registration. This move will help in cleaning the electoral roll and facilitate elector registration in the location at which persons are ordinarily residents


PROGRAM AIM – To raise awareness about the importance of blood donation and encourage NSS SCTCE members to contribute to this noble cause.


PROGRAM AIM- To enrol residents in the mission and gather essential information for effective waste management. The mission's goal is to create awareness about environmental issues, encourage community participation, and implement initiatives, such as monthly waste collection, to contribute to waste reduction and promote environmental sustainability.

PROGRAM SUMMARY- Solid waste management has become a major environmental issue in India. The increase in population and urbanization are largely responsible for the increase in solid waste. Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) includes mostly residential waste, commercial waste, and market waste, Domestic house waste, street sweeping etc. It consists of biodegradable waste, recyclable waste, inert waste, combustible and non-combustible waste etc. At present any scientific system has rarely been practiced for the safe disposal of municipal solid waste in the city. Insufficient storage, collection, transportation, treatment and disposal of waste lead to contamination of air, surface and groundwater, which result in formation of breeding grounds for vectors, pests, rodents, etc. causing public health problems. Proper planning for collection, transportation, treatment and disposal of solid waste are therefore extremely essential for the protection of environment, health, sanitation and social wellbeing of the people.



OUTCOME- The NSS SCTCE team's efforts paid off as they were able to enrol over 300 local residents into the mission and gather crucial information for effective waste management. The community showed great interest and enthusiasm in participating in waste reduction initiatives. This survey helped create awareness about environmental issues and fostered a sense of responsibility among the residents.
